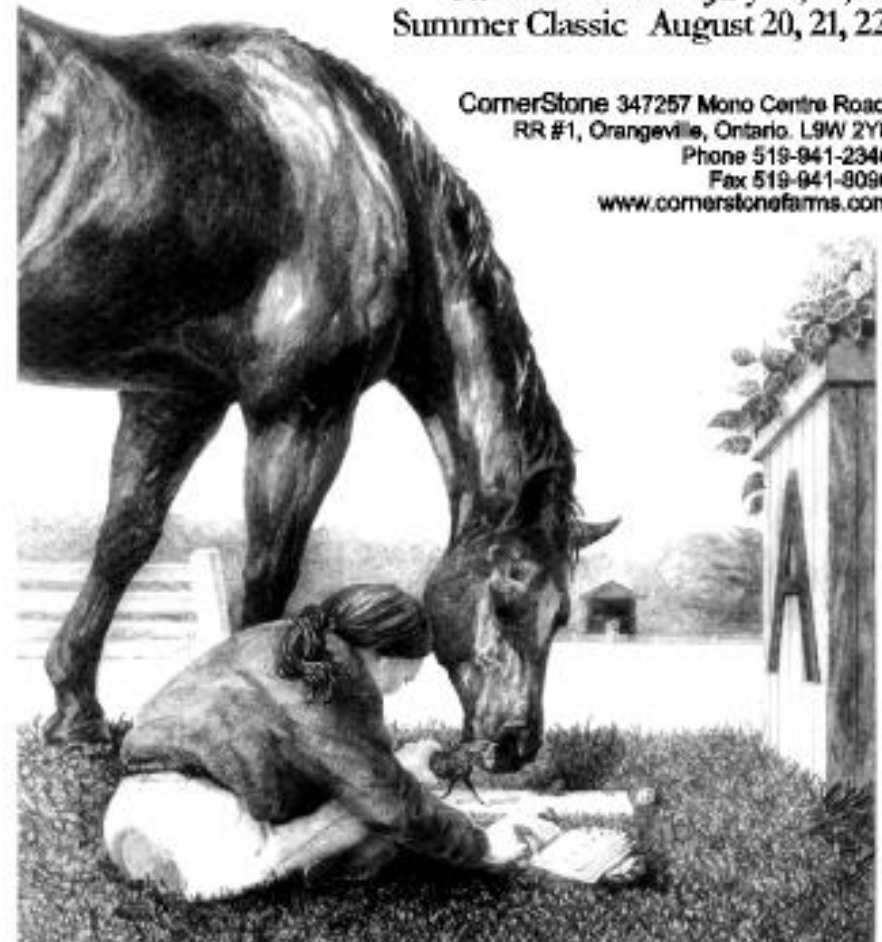

All competitors at a show with Gold Level sanctioning must have a Gold or Platinum Equine Canada Sport

License Membership.

CDI 3* -owners and riders must have Platinum membership.

Single Event Upgrade License is available for all Bronze or Silver EC members at a cost of \$15.00.

If using the single event upgrade, please add the \$15.00 fee to the total on your entry form.

PERSON RESPONSIBLE

The person responsible for a horse is an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC rules. This person is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. The Person Responsible must hold an EC individual or group License (see A203.5)

For the purpose of these rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or the competitor who rides the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian of Junior competitors.

The Person Responsible must sign the Entry Form and provide his/her EC membership number.

ADULT AMATEUR DIVISION: An Adult Amateur Division will be held in some levels. Adult Amateur entrants may also enter the Open Classes. Amateurs must hold an EC Amateur Card.

JUNIOR/PONY DIVISIONS: A Junior/Pony Division will be held in some levels. Juniors may also enter the Open Classes. Junior riders as defined by EC are those who have not reached their 18th birthday as of January 1, 2010.

SUITABILITY-LINE AND UNDER SADDLE CLASSES: These classes are non EC classes and therefore do not count towards any EC Awards or Points. During the ridden classes, horses may be asked to walk, trot and canter in each direction as a group. All ridden classes will be judged 50% gaits, 25% Conformation, 15% Manners and 10% Presentation.

These classes will NOT be offered at Spring Into Dressage National Show.

FEI PONY DIVISION: Riders may show in this division from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 12 until the end of the year they turn 16. Stewards will be available to do a temporary metric pony measurement at a time to be posted in the show office.

FREESTYLE CLASSES: We strongly recommend to all competitors to provide two copies of their music in case of technical difficulties. A sound check with the announcer may be arranged.

EVENT PARAMEDICS: Paramedics will be on site each Competition day.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: All motorized vehicles including golf carts, scooters, dirt bikes etc. must be operated by a licensed driver only.

SECURITY: Security will not be provided on the show grounds. CornerStone will not accept responsibility for items lost or damaged on the show grounds. Competitors are advised not to leave possessions, including tack unattended at any time.

Spring Into Dressage CDI 3* exhibitors will be in a Secured Stabling Area.

TACK CHECK: Under EC rules it is the Rider's responsibility to report to the ring Steward immediately after their test, without dismounting, for a tack check. Tack checks are not required before the test but an unofficial check may be done as a courtesy by the Steward. Failure to report to the Steward will result in elimination.

PRESENTATIONS: Ribbons and trophies may be picked up from the Results Table in the Pavilion as soon as the official results are posted. For the convenience of exhibitors, there will be no mounted or formal presentations unless there is a sponsor for the class. In which case, presentations may be mounted. Competitors will be advised in advance.

CAMPER SITES: Camper sites are available at \$175.00 per site per show. Water and electrical hookups are provided. Pump outs are available at an extra charge and must be booked in the office. Camping on the show grounds with or without hookups is not permitted without paying for a camper site. There is absolutely no grey water drainage allowed on the grounds. **CAMPER SPACE MUST BE RESERVED IN WRITING ON THE CAMPER REQUEST FORM FOUND IN THIS PRIZE LIST.**

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They therefore must take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and keep the policy up to date.

PARKING: Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. There is no parking on the roads or in the barn areas at any time. After unloading, please move your vehicles from the stabling area to the parking areas.

DOGS: All dogs must be on leads at all times. There is a \$100.00 fine for loose dogs. Remember to clean up after your dog.

QUERIES: Questions concerning rules, scoring or entries must be made to the Steward for discussion with the Organizing Committee. Protests must be made in writing within 48 hours of the completion of the class and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00, cash or certified cheque. See EC Rules. The show grounds may be monitored at any time of the day or night by the stewards.

CLASS LIMITATIONS: CornerStone reserves the right to limit entries, divide or combine classes and govern all conditions of the competitions. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

Please note: If there are fewer than 6 entries in any offered classes, Management reserves the right to combine classes that are scheduled as split (ie: Open, Junior, Amateur) within the same level.

WHIPS: Whips may be carried in most National Classes. See EC Rules.

DRUG TESTING: The EC/FEI Drug and Medications rules apply at these events. Any horse, entered at any competition, is subject to the requirement to pay drug testing fees and may, while on the competition grounds and on the recommendation of the Chair of the provincial Equine Medication Control committee or the Chair's appointee, be selected for equine medication control testing.

THE EQUINE CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equine Canada, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.

Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.

Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

Continuing to support specific studies on equine health and welfare.

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organizations rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

Reviewing, revising and developing competitions rules and regulations to protect the welfare of the horse. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

PASSPORTS: All competitors must present a valid EC or FEI passport for the horse being exhibited including a 2010 EC horse license sticker before receiving the number. Passports will be returned upon complete payment of account.

NUMBERS: If the account has not been paid in advance, an open signed cheque must be left with the Show Office in order to pick up the number. Competitor numbers must be worn at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as the competition rings.

RIDING TIMES: Riding times will be available at www.cornerstonefarms.com or www.equestrian-connection.com the weekend before each show.

NATIONAL SHOW STABLING: The cost per stall used is \$160.00 for the duration of the show. Day stalls are not available. Stalls are not bedded. Stalls will be available from 7 a.m. Thursday. Shavings and hay are available for purchase upon arrival. No pre orders will be accepted. Orders for same day delivery must be received in the office by 11 a.m. Please bathe horses in wash rack areas only. Horses arriving on Wednesday will be charged an additional \$20.00.

CDI 3* STABLING: \$200.00 per stall. Security provided. Please use the separate stabling form.

Barns or Individuals who wish to be stabled together should fill out one form listing all the horses and required tack stalls. This should avoid the problem of duplicate stall bookings or competitors not being stabled with the barn of their choice.

Please note: If you have a stallion or a horse that does not like his neighbours please bring your own boards for extending the wall partitions. The show will endeavour to accommodate your special requests but will not guarantee it.

EXERCISE/SCHOOLING SCHEDULE: Competition rings will be available for schooling on Thursday from 9 am until dark.

Competition rings are closed to schooling on competition days.

RING SIZES: All classes will be run in 20m x 60m rings.

TESTS: Dressage Tests will be the current EC and FEI Tests. Tests may be downloaded from www.dressagecanada.org. They are available from the Ontario Equestrian Federation, 9120 Leslie St. Suite 203, Richmond Hill, Ontario. L4B 3J9. Telephone-905-709-6545).

CornerStone Horse Shows General Rules and Regulations

ENTRIES: Entries must be accompanied by a cheque if mailed.

Post dated cheques will not be accepted.

Entries must be received by the Secretary at 347257 Mono Centre Rd. RR #1, Orangeville, Ontario. L9W 2Y8 by the closing date.

Faxed entries are subject to a \$10.00 service charge. The show does not take responsibility for faxed entries. Competitors should check by email or phone that their faxed entry has been received.

Incomplete entries will be charged an additional \$10.00.

FEES: **An signed, open cheque** for entries not paid in advance must be left with the office before a number is released. **We do not accept credit cards.**

CornerStone reserves the right to request guaranteed funds **in advance** from customers with a history of late or non negotiable payments. Outstanding accounts from previous shows will be settled first before any monies submitted are credited to the current shows' account.

Please make cheques payable to CornerStone. Any cheque returned by the bank for any reason will be charged a \$50.00 fee.

CANCELLATION POLICY: Refunds of 100% of entry and stabling fees, less the administration fee will be made prior to the closing date of entries. Refunds of 50% of class entry fees will be made after the closing date and before the start of the show. There will be NO refunds on stabling fees after the closing date.

Scratches after the show starts will lose the total entry/stabling fees.

Veterinary or doctor certificates are not required for any scratches.

LATE ENTRIES: will be accepted at the discretion of the show management subject to space availability in classes and a late fee of \$30.00.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: There will be a fee of \$25.00 per day charged for any non-showing horse. Non-showing horses must complete an entry form including signing the waver. They must wear a number while in the schooling and exercise areas. Administration and drug fees will be applied

HORS CONCOURS: Competitors will be accepted at the discretion of the organizing committee if space is available. See EC Rule 2.8.5 a-d.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

The following methods of calculating the Champion and Reserve Champion will be used in 2010.

Starter Division

Percentage Scores from Tests A, B, C and D will be added together.

Training Level, First Level and Second Level

Percentage Scores from Test 1, Test 2, Test 3 and Test 4 will be added together.

Third Level and Fourth Level

Percentage Scores from Test 1, Test 2 and Test 3 will be added together.

FEI Young Rider, FEI Junior, FEI Pony

Percentage Scores from the Team, Individual (PSG for YR) and Freestyle will be added together.

Advanced

Percentage Scores from the Prix St. Georges Open on Friday, Intermediaire on Saturday and the Intermediaire Freestyle on Sunday will be added together. (Classes 21, 50, 81)

Amateur Prix St. Georges

Percentage Scores from PSG Amateur Classes held Friday, Saturday and Sunday will be added together. (Classes 28, 56, 87)

Grand Prix

Percentage Scores from Grand Prix, Grand Prix Special and Grand Prix Freestyle will be added together. (Classes 22, 51, 82)

Please note that scores from the "Test of Choice" classes and the PSG Open Class on Saturday Class 49 and Sunday Class 80 do not count towards any Championships under any circumstances.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
